1 Who?



- Internationally trained physicians outside of RCPSC-approved jurisdiction/ program
- Royal College grants eligibility to write the RCPSC exam via the practice eligibility route
- Please contact RCPSC for eligibility requirements and the process

2 Steps?



Steps to be completed before you are eligible to apply for a license with CPSO:

- 1) Apply to the RCPSC
- 2) Obtain eligibility to write examinations via the practice eligibility route
- 3) Pass the written examination in primary specialty
- 4) Also must have passed QE1 and obtained LMCC

Requirements under the restricted certificate:

- 1) Practice under supervision to complete the RCPSC's time-in-practice requirement and pass all outstanding examinations
- 2) Obtain Royal College Certification

4 Certificate Type?



- Restricted certificate of registration to practice under supervision and limited to scope and location
- Once RCPSC certification is obtained, may be eligible to apply for:
 - Independent Practice Certificate of Registration
- License is valid for three years or until you have obtained certification with RCPSC

5 Eligible for CPSO License?



- 1) Once you have successfully passed the RCPSC written examination, the QE1, and the LMCC, or acceptable qualifying exam, you may be eligible for CPSO Licensure under the PER policy
- 2) For an IP once all outstanding RCPSC examinations and RCPSC time in practice requirement has been met and you have obtained certification
